OPEN CALL FOR YOUNG TALENTS

The REVIVE project partners are inviting young creative minds in exploring how cultural heritage can inspire communities in developing new sustainable living models.

Becoming a member of a multidisciplinary international creative team is a great opportunity to learn, explore, co-create and test innovative solutions for reviving old historical towns and sites.

This will be achieved through **physical and virtual experimentation** in four selected specific urban sites, each facing their own challenges common to many cities, towns and villages across Europe: **Tržič (Slovenia)**, **Iași (Romania)**, **Cellino Attanasio (Italy)**, **Turku (Finland)**.

We are now looking for young talents to become part of creative teams for live experiments taking place this year in Slovenia from 30th of June until 14th of July and Finland from 30th of September to 14th of October 2024.

In the Alpine historic town of Tržič, Slovenia, you will co-create and build a green open public space, as a new centre for the urban/town community. In the urban city of Turku, Finland, young talents shall test video-mapping and projections as a tool for revitalisation of the abandoned industrial heritage site.

A part from the onsite experiments, the selected young talents are required to participate in the preparatory online activities:

- a joint online Bootcamp (to learn more about the location and meet the relevant stakeholders as well as the other team members)
- a transnational online capacity building event (to learn and get inspired from good practice examples).

These will be organised prior to each experiment. Additional (informal) online meetings could be added depending on the needs.





This call is for you if:

- you are between 18 and 30 years old;
- you live in (or you are a national of) Slovenia, Finland, Romania, Italy, Spain or Croatia. Note: apart from travelling to experiments to other countries you can also participate in the experiment in your own country.
- you are a student or a recent graduate in the following fields: architecture, cultural heritage, restoration, visual or performing arts, history, anthropology, urbanism, landscape planning, communication, digital media, ecology, civil engineering...or any related fields that you believe the project would benefit from;
- you are open-minded with interest in other cultures;
- you have a good level of written and spoken English;
- you are able to commit to the project and travel to the onsite experiments during the above mentioned dates as well as to participate in the online preparatory activities.

How to apply?

The applications are received by the project partners. Select your country and apply by sending your CV and motivation letter together with the portfolio (if you have one – not obligatory) explaining how you could contribute to the project and which experiment you would like to participate in.

It is possible to participate in more than one experiment (subject to availability). Deadline for submission of application: **29th of January 2024**

What do you get?

- Valuable international experience in cultural heritage revitalisation
- Opportunity to learn from others and build your capacity in the field
- Fully funded travel and all costs of accommodation and food covered during the 2 weeks long onsite experiment
- Certificate of participation and possible recommendation letters for your future projects and applications.





Evaluation process:

- Received applications will be revised between **30th of January and 7th of February 2024** by each of the project partners in their own countries who will create a pre-selection list. The final team composition for each experiment is jointly decided by all partners.
- Successful candidates will be informed at the latest by 15th of February 2024.
- Those that are not selected this time are able to apply again for the second round in 2025 (the call will be launched towards the end of 2024).
